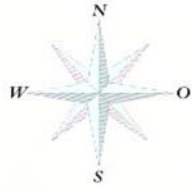
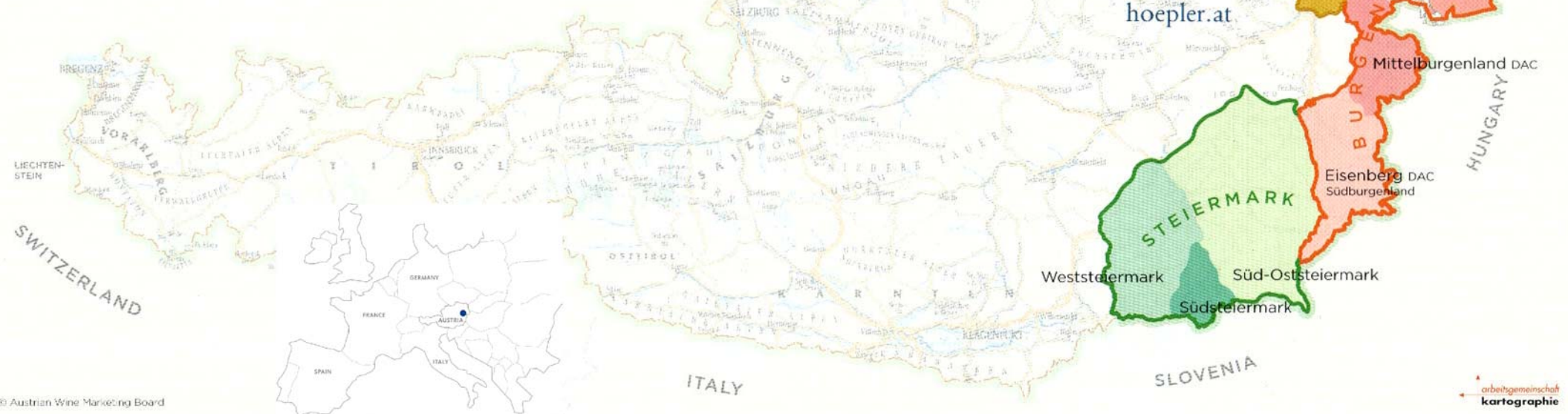


# AUSTRIAN WINE

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## NIEDERÖSTERREICH (LOWER AUSTRIA) (29.550 HA)

The wine-growing area of Niederösterreich, or Lower Austria, shows the rich potential of the terroir and wine styles of this vast wine land along the Danube river. In the eight specific wine-growing areas of Niederösterreich, which is also a federal state, the most important wine styles - those which are characteristic of the region - enjoy the most prominence. Of course, also many other styles get to feature the Niederösterreich designation: there are rarities, plus an array of international varieties such as Chardonnay, Weißburgunder (Pinot Blanc) and Sauvignon Blanc, as well as elegant red wines and sweet wine specialties.

## BURGENLAND (13.950 HA)

The designation „Burgenland“ represents the vast creativity and prominent image of this innovative wine country. The spectrum ranges from great white wines and full bodied red wines to an array of noble sweet wines. These wine categories include some archetypes that have developed in specific wine-growing areas.

## STEIERMARK (4.800 HA)

The Steiermark wine-growing area consists of three specific Styrian wine areas. Increasingly, producers are labelling their wines - from fresh Welschriesling to the full-bodied Morillon - with this powerful name. And this allows for wine styles which are characteristic of specific areas, but have not yet been specifically designated - to be more clearly defined, such as the classic Schilcher, or the Sauvignon Blanc from Südsteiermark.

## WIEN (550 ha)

Wine-growing in a major capital city? In Vienna, it's a tradition. And today, with 550 hectares of vineyards, it plays an important economic role. In fact, these vineyards contribute to the preservation of the green belt - something that helps form the basis of high wine quality. The excellent range of wines here include the quintessential Gemischter Satz, elegant Riesling, robust Weißburgunder (Pinot Blanc), and precious red wines as well.
